Our Kindergarten

Aspendale North Kindergarten (ANK) Inc. was officially opened on 31 October 1970. ANK is affiliated with the Department of Education and Training (DET), City of Kingston and is a member of Early Learning Association Australia (ELAA).

The Kindergarten is managed by a Committee of Management made up of volunteer parent/ carers. It is the responsibility of the Committee to work collaboratively with staff to maintain the

kindergarten to the highest possible standards. All parents/carers are encouraged to nominate at our annual AGM held in November each year.

Our Program

ANK provides an emerging and flexible curriculum that encourages freedom of thought and is inspired by children's ideas, needs and interests. It encapsulates creative thinking, develops a sense of agency and is open ended. Children are encouraged to plan, implement and complete projects while valuing the process, rather than just the final product. We support considered risk-taking which allows children to test, push and re-define their own boundaries as their abilities develop. All children are encouraged and supported to make independent decisions to explore, create, problem-solve, collaborate and imagine.

At ANK we value strong, trusting, respectful relationships with children and their families. Children are listened to and their developmental needs are catered for. Families are encouraged to be involved in program decisions and their child's learning. We respect and value the cultural diversity of our community and strive to make positive local connections. We acknowledge the importance of educators and families working together to facilitate the learning journey of each child, both at kinder, at home and in the wider community.

ANK offers a variety of learning experiences through 'play' that incorporate art, drama, science, literacy, numeracy, movement, music and technology. Through our early literacy and language program we offer Auslan (sign language) which the children readily embrace. We utilise community facilities such as local parks, shops and schools for excursions, and carefully choose incursion experiences that will enrich the children's current interests and knowledge.

Our teaching team aims to provide an environment that encourages the values of security, friendship, trust, understanding, responsibility, co-operation, safety, independence and care for the environment and nature.
